Thank you for considering the enrollment of your child (ren) in South Bay Christian Academy. S.B.C.A. is an integral and inseparable part of South Bay Pentecostal Church of Chula Vista, and was formed and now functions for the primary purpose of training the Christian young people of South Bay Pentecostal Church to live for God for time and eternity, as opposed to seeking youth from outside homes, or purposing to reform presently wayward youth. No “unchurched” young people will be considered without a letter of recommendation from their pastor.

All faculty members are required to be faithful members of this church, or one whose doctrinal and holiness standards are in harmony with this church. They must be fully trained in the AOP and/or ABEKA required training, depending on their area of labor.

S.B.C.A. accommodates infants (in our preschool) through 12<sup>th</sup> grades, running a 4-day school week, 8:00 – 3:30 daily. Sessions are Monday thru Thursday. Pre-K sessions are Monday – Friday 6:00am – 6:00p.m... (A separate information packet is available for Pre-K information)

**STEPS OF ENROLLMENT:**

- Read the Handbook before attempting to secure an interview. It will answer many questions.

- After application has been reviewed by the principal, you will be called for a parent/student/principal interview. The appointment will be speedily scheduled so that you will not be inconvenienced.
- At this interview you will receive enrollment forms.

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**BILLING:**

All accounts are billed on the 1st and due on the 10th of each month. The first payment is due Aug. 10<sup>th</sup>, and the last payment is due May 10th. All delinquent accounts (those not paid by the due date) will be charged a **LATE CHARGE of \$25.00**. An account that remains delinquent until the 1st of the following month (2 weeks) will force the suspension of those students on the offending account until it is brought up to date.

### BOYS:

-Pants Navy or Khaki twill pants from Choice Uniforms or True Grits. (Plain, straight leg style) Must be purchased at the above mentioned uniform shops.

-Shirts: **JR & SR. HIGH:** White, long sleeve Oxford collar or standard dress shirt, for Chapel days or special events.  
Navy Blue, long or short sleeved polo shirt, **with logo for non chapel days.**

**KINDERGARTEN THROUGH ELEMENTARY:** Same, but may be either long or short sleeved (white or blue dress shirt). Optional red or navy polo, long or short sleeved shirts with logo for non-chapel days.

**White or blue dress shirts must be worn on Chapel days with school tie.**

-Belt: Solid black, or navy blue.

-Shoes: Solid black (including sole), or navy blue: Dress type; dress boots are ok. No canvas or cloth shoes except in the K & Primary Classes. **(IF IT LOOKS LIKE A TENNIS SHOE IT IS OUT!)**  
**If in doubt, check with school office.**

-Socks: Solid black, navy blue, white or white w/stripes is ok. (Must be at least 2" inches above the ankle) No sport type socks.

-Ties: Solid navy blue. Must be purchased at the above mentioned uniform shops.  
**NO EXCEPTIONS!**

-Sweater/Jacket: \*\*See Footnote.

## **BOYS' P.E. UNIFORM:**

Applies only to Elementary through Secondary. There is no P.E. uniform requirement for Kindergarten & Primary grades.

-Pants: Solid navy blue sweat pants. Must be new for 2010-2011 school year.

-Shirt: Red & White 3/4 sleeve T-shirt. Item must be purchased at:

The current cost for the shirt is \$17.98, includes school lettering, student's last name, and number. The lettering must be Royal Blue **ONLY**.

**BE SURE IT DOESN'T FIT TOO TIGHTLY.**

-Socks: White Athletic and/or white w/stripe: red, blue or red/blue combination.

-Shoes: Tennis; Solid white, solid navy, solid black, or a white/navy or black combination.

-Sweatshirt: Red or Blue with school logo. This is not a mandatory item, but is optional.

## **GIRLS:**

### **KINDERGARTEN THROUGH ELEMENTARY**

-Jumpers: Plaid jumpers purchased from the above mentioned uniform shops. Must be at least 2" inches below the bottom of the knee.

-Blouses: White, long or short sleeved, Peter Pan or Oxford collar. Must be purchased at the uniform shops listed.

-Socks/

Leotards: Solid navy, dark green, white, & yellow (not gold). **NO OTHER COLORS!**  
Socks must be at least 2" inches above the ankle.

-Shoes: Solid black (including sole), navy blue or white. Closed heel and toe. Boots are ok. No rivets, studs, etc...plain boots only. No cloth or jelly type shoes.

## GIRLS:

### JR. & SR. HIGH

- Skirts: Navy Blue or Khaki long skirt, must be purchased from Choice Uniforms. Plaid skirt can be purchased from any of the three uniform shops.  
**ALL SKIRTS MUST BE AT LEAST 2" INCHES BELOW THE BOTTOM OF THE KNEES, AT ALL TIMES!** (THIS INCLUDES WHEN SITTING)  
Must be ordered no less than 30 days before the start of school.
- Blouses: White or light blue, long-sleeved, Peter Pan or Oxford collar dress shirt. **Also available are green long sleeve, polo shirts. Plaid skirt is only to be worn with white blouse or green, long sleeve, polo shirt.** All blouses must be purchased from Choice Uniforms, Dennis or True Grits.
- Hosiery: Stockings may be used by Sr. High only. Optional is sheer neutral, solid navy or solid white. NO LEG WARMERS OR LEOTARDS.
- Socks: Solid, navy, dark green, white or yellow (not gold). NO OTHER COLORS  
Must be at least 2" inches above the ankle.
- Shoes: Solid black (including sole), navy blue or white. Closed heel and toe. Boots are ok. No rivets, studs, etc...plain boots only. No cloth or jelly type shoes.

## GIRLS P.E.:

**Applies only to Elementary through Secondary. There is no P.E. uniform requirement for Kindergarten & Primary classes.**

- Culottes: Navy Blue. Must be purchased from Choice Uniforms, Dennis or True Grits. Must be at least 2" inches below the bottom of the knees, at all times.
- Shirts: Red & White long sleeved T-shirts. Same as boys, see boys' requirements.  
**(PLEASE, BE CAREFUL THAT YOUR SHIRT IS NOT TIGHT.)**
- Shoes: Same as boys' P.E. requirements.
- Socks: Same as boys' P.E. requirements.
- Sweatshirts: Same as boys' Optional P.E. requirements.

## **SWEATER/CARDIGANS**

For **ALL STUDENTS**, K-12<sup>th</sup> grade:

Navy Blue, Red, Yellow or Dark Green Cardigans.

Navy Blue, Red, Yellow or Dark Green V-neck pull-over, or vest.

All items must be purchased through Choice Uniforms, Dennis, or True Grits.

## **JACKETS**

Standard Jackets with S.B.C.A. logo are available through the office or in True Grits. It is not a mandatory item, but it is highly recommended.

Adult Sizes - \$52.95

Prices are subject to change.

**We will be ordering at the end of September.**

**\*\*NOTE CONCERNING SWEATERS/JACKETS:** An outer covering is not mandatory; however, if an outer garment is to be worn, it must be S.B.C.A. Uniform. Other outer coverings will be allowed on campus, but not in the Learning Centers or in Chapel. Only the S.B.C.A. Uniform Garment can be worn in the Learning Centers and in Chapel. Please, don't let it get cold on your student without having secured their **APPROVED GARMENT!!!**

Jackets are ordered during the second week after school begins in September. **ONE ORDER GOES OUT EACH YEAR!!!**

**\*\*\*PLEASE NOTE: UNIFORMS THAT ARE TOO OLD OR FADED WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED FOR SCHOOL USE. ALSO, UNIFORMS SHOULD FIT PROPERLY (NOT TOO BIG OR TOO SMALL).**

# State of California Immunization Requirements For School and Child Care

According to The California Code of Regulations<sup>^</sup>, children must have a minimum number of immunizations (shots) before they can attend school or child care. The child's immunization record may contain more immunizations than are shown below. This chart shows the vaccines required to enter/attend school or child care. Please consult with your medical provider for more information on all shots a child may need to stay healthy.

Child's age:	List of shots required to attend school or child care:
<b>2 - 3 months</b>	1 Polio, 1 DTaP, 1 Hib, 1 Hep B
<b>4 - 5 months</b>	2 Polio, 2 DTaP, 2 Hib, 2 Hep B
<b>6 - 14 months</b>	2 Polio 3 DTaP 2 Hib, 2 Hep B
<b>15 - 17 months</b>	3 Polio, 3 DTaP 1 Hib must be given on or after the first birthday* 1 MMR must be given on or after the first birthday* 2 Hep B
<b>18 months - 5 years</b>	3 Polio 4 DTaP 1 Hib must be given on or after the first birthday* 1 MMR must be given on or after the first birthday* 3 Hep B 1 Varicella <sup>1</sup>
<b>Kindergarten</b>	4 Polio <sup>2</sup> 5 DTaP <sup>3</sup> 2 MMR <sup>4</sup> both must be given on or after the first birthday* 3 Hep B 1 Varicella <sup>1</sup>
<b>7<sup>th</sup> Grade</b>	4 Polio <sup>5</sup> 4 DTaP, DTP, Td, or DT <sup>6</sup> 2 MMR <sup>4</sup> both must be given on or after the first birthday* 3 Hep B <sup>7</sup> 1 Varicella <sup>**1</sup> [1 Td booster <sup>8</sup> ]

<sup>^</sup>Title 17, Division 1, Chapter 4, Subchapter 8, Article 5, Section 6065

\* Receipt of the dose up to (and including) 4 days before the first birthday will satisfy the school and child care entry immunization requirement. This is known as "the four day grace period."

\*\*Required for children not enrolled in California schools before July 1, 2001 – applies to all kindergarten entrants plus out-of-state entrants into grades 1-12. 1 dose of varicella vaccine required if immunized before age 13; 2 doses needed if vaccine received after the 13<sup>th</sup> birthday.

<sup>1</sup> Physician-documented varicella (chickenpox) disease history on immunization record also meets the varicella requirement.

<sup>2</sup> 3 doses meet the requirement for ages 4 - 6 years if at least 1 was given on or after the fourth\* birthday.

<sup>3</sup> 4 doses meet the requirement for ages 4 - 6 years if at least 1 was given on or after the fourth\* birthday.

<sup>4</sup> Two doses of measles-containing vaccine required. One dose of mumps and rubella-containing vaccine required; mumps vaccine is not required for children 7 years of age and older.

<sup>5</sup> 3 doses meet the requirement for ages 7 - 17 years if at least 1 was given on or after the second\* birthday.

<sup>6</sup> 3 doses meet the requirement for ages 7 - 17 years if at least 1 was given on or after the second\* birthday.

<sup>7</sup> 2 doses of adult (Recombivax) formulation hepatitis B vaccine along with provider documentation that the adult formulation hepatitis B vaccine was used for BOTH doses (and both doses were received at ages 11-15 years) will also fulfill the 7<sup>th</sup> grade requirement.

<sup>8</sup> 1 Td booster is recommended but not required.

California Immunization Law allows for exemptions from these requirements for personal beliefs or medical reasons. Ask the school or your child care provider for details.
